Due to circumstances beyond our control, unfortunately we have had to cancel this week's assembly. We sincerely apologise if this has caused parents any inconvenience.

END OF AN ERA

During the upcoming school holidays, the music room will be demolished.

Originally a house, the building was donated to the school by local Augusta residents the Webster family.

Back in 1994, the school P&C took just six days to dismantle and remove the house from the Webster's property, in preparation for installation at the school.

Local builder, Kim Darragh, coordinated the build, calling upon help from fishermen, contractors, shopkeepers, grandfathers, teachers, bankers, off-duty police officers and a band of dedicated mums.

The house became the new library resource centre, replacing the congested and unsuitable converted storeroom. In 2011, the school moved into the current library and Webster House became the school's music room.

While the removal of Webster House will take some getting used to, the students will not be disadvantaged in any way, and the school will continue to deliver music activities.
